CCSA is a support and social group for people who are M2F, F2M, intersex, and/or cross-dressers, and their family/friends. Our events are at selected safe venues. CCSA can also provide information on the transition process and recommendations to medical practitioners/specialists.

Bfriend is a support service for those questioning their sexuality and/or gender identity. This support is offered through a volunteer based mentoring system. We also offer regular social events for men, women and trans-folk as well as ad hoc special interest groups and a bi-monthly newsletter.

- * A trans community dinner on the 3rd Friday of every month
- * An event for International Transgender Day of Remembrance
- * An annual transgender roundtable.
